Royal St George End of Season Race 2016

For this year's End of season Race, a course of 4.5 miles was selected, which started line off the Dublin Bay Sailing Club hut on the west pier, with a reach to South Bull, reach to Middle, a beat to Merrion, reach to Salthill and a run to the finish. The sun was shining, and the wind of about 9 knots was strong enough to keep all the boats moving well.

First boat to start was the oldest boat in the fleet, Paul Gillespie's historic *Calypso*, an International 12 footer designed in 1913, and a class which was used as the single handed boat in the 1920 and 1928 Olympic Games. He spent the longest time on the racecourse, and his progress around the long course was in contrast with Chris Power-Smith's J122, *Aurelia* which was the last boat to start, five minutes behind the fleet, he finished in third position. We were disappointed that the Moths didn't fly this year. Other remarkable competitors were the Wesail competitors Thomas in a Squibs who steered the whole race, and others such as Declan in *Perfection, and* who steered part of the race. These guys are now showing impressive levels of skill.

The best dressed boat was Robin Syke's Hanse, *Jama* on which all the crew won fancy dress, and close behind was ?????*Escapade*, a Ron Holland Eyghtine where all the crew wore funny spectacles.

The Cour d'elegance award must go to our rear commodore, Frank O'Byrne's beautifully presented *Samphire*.

This race maintains the club tradition of a fun night for all the members, irrespective of sailing speed.
