Monday 15th May WeSail 10 sailors each week, 4 Volunteers

WeSail (formally known as Special Needs Sailing) has started for the 2017 sailing season. WeSail is a sailing program for adults from the age of 18 with intellectual disability. This program runs on Monday evenings with up to 10 sailors spending the evening on the water building their confidence and sailing skills aboard the three Club Squibs. Some of the athletes race on Tuesday evenings with the Squib class. The WeSail program is a program run by volunteers and is seeking additional experienced sailors and volunteers to contribute to the continued success of a growing program. Tuesday 16th May Schools Sailing Dun Laoghaire Rathdown Schools Sailing program **120 sailors each week, 16 instructors**

The RSGYC offers a number of sail training and sailing activities for schools in the locality. For six Tuesdays and Wednesdays in April and May the RSGYC welcomes 60 sailors from local schools each day for an afternoon of sail training in Optimists. The program is run in conjunction with Dun Laoghaire Rathdown council and the dlr Sports Partnership and facilitated in conjunction with our sailing partners the INSS. This program provides these children with a great introduction to sailing and being safe around the water while also showcasing the RSGYC in the local area.

uSail 7 new sailors

uSail is the RSGYC Adult Sail training program which runs May – September. This program offers sailing lessons aboard the Club 1720's in a fun and relaxed environment. Sailing gear is provided; all that is required is an appetite for fun and learning. The uSail program is a popular program for introducing new members to the Club and also for those members and their friends who wish to get some formal sail training while having a good time and meeting like-minded individuals. program has new courses starting most weeks, with sessions typically taking place on Tuesday and Thursday evenings and/ or on weekends. DBSC Dinghy & Keelboat racing approx. 60 sailors

On Wednesday the RSGYC has hosted a group sailing activity for an afternoon sail training/ regatta for a Club member's company outing. The Club member invited his company & team to the RSGYC for a unique and memorable 'off site' activity. The activity was tailor designed to suit the individual requirements of the group. An afternoon cruise in the Bay and 'Try Sailing' sessions are popular. This group were thrill seekers elected the 'Regatta' option where the competitive nature of the team was embraced. Water Wag racing approx. 20 sailors

Each Wednesday evening the Water Wag class race in the harbour. This class is growing with over 25 boats regularly on the start line for competitive and fun racing.

Optimist Team Racing approx. 14 sailors, 2 coaches

Thursday 18th May Regular DBSC Race evening approx. 300+ sailors

Thursday evenings is a busy one with over 300 sailors taking to the water in all classes and types of boats to compete in the DBSC Thursday evening race series. The Club launches are busy ferrying sailors to boats on moorings and the West Bight, the two Club cranes are launching Dry Sailed boats and the slipway is also busy with the launch of the first Flying 15 launching from the Club slip in a number of years. Needless to say, the racing is great fun and returning to shore for the Club BBQ and refreshments is eagerly anticipated.

Friday 19th May Schools Sailing approx. approx. 40 young sailors each week

Fridays are busy with Schools sailing activities taking place in the afternoon and evening with St. Conleth's School & St. Marys National School, Donnybrook.

This is the second year of our Club member schools sailing program where we welcome schools for Fridays in May with the students have spending Friday afternoons/ evenings learning to sail. St. Conleth's have been learning to sail using the fleet of Club Optimists while St. Marys have been

cruising around the harbour and Bay aboard the Club 1720's. The new sailors are having a great time afloat (and in the water after sailing) with their interest in sailing most definitely awakened.

Combined Clubs Junior Friday evening race series approx. 30+ sailors and 10 volunteers

Each Friday up to mid- June there is Friday evening racing for all Junior Classes. This racing takes place inside the harbour with over 80 sailors from all Clubs taking to the water every Friday. Two races are run each evening and all race management and safety support is provided by parents and volunteers who are happy to start their weekend afloat on Friday evenings followed by some enjoyable food, refreshments and comradeship ashore afterwards.

Friday Laser Coaching 10 – 12 sailors, 1 Coach

Friday evenings and Sunday mornings at the RSGYC has regular Laser Class coaching for the 'Masters'. Parents and seasoned sailors have come together for coaching in the laser class for adult sailors of all abilities. These clinics have some of Europe's top Optimist coaches training and preparing our Optimist sailors for the many regional, national and international competitions that the sailors compete in. The optimist sailors are some of the most dedicated sailors and can be seen coaching and sailing on practically any given weekend.

Sunday 21st May Sea Squirts & Tigers 20+ sailors, 5 instructors

Sunday mornings for some is a quiet time- not at 9:30am at the RSGYC when over 20+ new and improving sailors between the ages of 6 and 12 are welcomed to their Club for a morning of sail training and their weekly fix of 'messing about in boats' as part of the Sea Squirts & Tigers program. This program introduces our youngest sailors to sailing and encourages them to be safe and comfortable around boats and the water. These budding sailors truly are a sight to behold. Their excitement is infectious and the fun they have really is truly invigorating. The program runs every Sunday morning under the expert and safe instruction of our ISA qualified instructors and the watchful eyes of parents who assist with the program. The program welcomes friends of sailors/ members who wish to try sailing and has been a great introduction to the Club for non- members who are interested in becoming Club members.
