SB East Coast Championships

Competitor Briefing -- Friday, May 19th

My name is Barry O'Neill and I will be your R.O. for the event.

On behalf of the R. St. G. Y. C. and your Race Management Team I would just like to register a very warm welcome to all and hope you have a splendid weekend with lots of races.

- Event = SPRINT Racing. Your SB Committee has directed as many races as possible within the time "windows" in the NOR (with 1 discard after 4 completed) = no hanging about.
 - Bottom line is I want to get you racing with the minimum hanging about for all --
 - My reputation with SB 20s + FFs + Dragons etc =
 - o a really fast turnaround between races
 - so be warned = stay close to the Comm. boat -- hooter not that loud!
 - and we like to start on time = not too keen on waiting for stragglers -- Saturday = we may be a long way from the Harbour (to avoid DBSC Club Courses in afternoon)
 - But clearly we are dictated to some extent by the fickleness of the wind and the ability of Rib Teams to move marks fast.

Committee Boat:

- Navy blue Motor Cruiser -- Brouette -- with white top
- Flying George ensign on the transom
- on the dock now

• Race Area Location:

 Saturday + Sunday = will locate in the West + Middle of the bay – depending on wind + DBSC Club activities

Saturday:

- A lot on in Dublin Bay
- And high water
- So West = good bet
- We will find a gap somewhere between DBSC Fixed marks t—most likely to West of bay

Sunday:

 closer to harbour / middle of bay as less competition for space

The Racing

- Ideally Start on Time = be warned
- o 3 Minute Sequence

Start

- Start Line =
 - between the dan buoy with orange flag at PORT end and
 - Red / white pole on Comm Boat at STARBOARD end
 - 3 Minute Sequence

Marks

- Weather + Spreader + Leeward Gate =
 - small Orange Tea Bags

o Finish line:

- dan buoy with a Blue Flag located to windward of the Committee Boat --
- Blue finish line flag will be on the bow of the Committee boat
- see diag Appendix A = IMPORTANT

Courses

- Windward / Leeward
- o Default is 2 Rounds -- 20 / 30 min races
- MAY <u>increase</u> to 3 if for example wind increases and tubs speed up
- o OR shorten to 1 round if:
 - fleet slow vs Target Race Times or
 - significant wind shift or
 - race a procession?
- Take care to listen for hooter / gun re finish -- may set a 3 Lap and plan to finish after 2 - or 1 lap?
- o All dictated by time

Key point re Courses:

it is MANDATORY for All boats to sail through the Finish Line at the end of EVERY lap Course Diag. below.

Note that most are conditioned to round the L Mark and head upwind -- this course requires competitors to sail from L to the Finish and then upwind

Race Management Policy

The Start

- First Start will be a Peter -- however
 - o If a General and OUR Fault -- e.g.
 - Line not square?
 - Not long enough
 - Then I shall stick with a Peter.
- If a General -- and <u>FLEET</u> Fault = trigger happy -- I shall go to a U -- or Black if behaviour continues
 - And may not go back to Peter
- Remember Tides

- Plan is to sail as many races of approx. 20/30 mins in the allocated time:
 - o Could be 5 (or more) races a day
 - If I do not have to re-lay Start line I plan to go into sequence VERY quickly = NO hanging about
 - So please stay close to Comm. Boat and watch for sound signal
- Use of the W Flag -
 - o if stragglers may use a W + Whistle / horn?
 - W means you are listed as a Finisher where u are positioned on the Course
 - No need to complete the course
 - Simply return to the start area for the next Race ASAP
 - You are NOT ranked as a Did Not Finish == you get points equivalent to your position on the Race Course at time of W and whistle (from a Rib)

• Racing in Heavy Weather

- Our number One Priority is Safety but you need to bear in mind the following:
 - Event is a REGIONAL Championships
 - Very skilled sailors -- and some less skilled
 - Less skilled may choose not to go out to race some days or races?
 - There is NO stigma attached to such a decision
 - Only <u>you</u> know your crew skill set and limitations so the onus is on you to make the sensible call
- Mark Laying -- Stay out of way please

Can you please help Start Line rib teams by staying out of the way while they stream Marks -- esp. the Start line and L ?

Final thought:

 Remember the need to sail through the Finish on completion of ALL Laps as per Course plan below
