Safety Features

- Essential check-out of Rib's for
 - Anchor, chain and warp (secured to Rib)
 - Bow warp not to be longer than length of Rib
 - VHF radio as the primary communications tool
 - Paddles and boat hook
 Safety box (know what is inside)
 Compass for outside harbour
 Knife (personal gear)
 2 fuel tanks
 Bucket / bailer
 Suitable towline
 Spare kill cord
 - Air in sponsons to the appropriate pressure.
- Prepare & know the weather state, forecast, visibility including sea state/tide as it changes
- Conduct a suitable risk assessment for the planned passage
- Personal Gear
 - Suitable buoyancy aid / PFD (for age /weight) to be properly worn on **outside** of all clothing
 - Cap, waterproof and warm clothing, whistle and knife, suitable footwear.
- Know the area and any hazards, including shipping / other event(s) movements
 - Passage planning is essential. Ribs are restricted to their defined area of operation (e.g. no landing on Dalkey Island(s) or crossing the Liffey fairway)
- Rib Operation
 - Be fully aware of the Ribs handling characteristics and limitations
 - Only qualified persons may drive the Ribs (min. IS / RYA National Cert)
 - Minimum age is 16 year
 - Use kill cord **ALWAYS** (attached to the Rib driver as personal gear)
 - Disconnect the key from the kill cord when operating Rib
 - Sit or straddle seat ONLY
 - Harbour speed limit is 5knts
 - Arrive and leave George with **ZERO** speed and wake
 - No smoking (you have at least 22 litres of petrol on board)
 - Zero alcohol
 - No passengers forward of the console
 - Be aware of 360-degree movements around you, and keep checking
 - 2 people aboard for safety / rescue function
 - Ensure that the Rib trim is appropriate for load / passengers
 - Tow with the greatest of care, and with prior preparation
 - 'Wave jumping', wake boarding or skiing etc. are all <u>strictly</u> prohibited
 - Racing is absolutely prohibited
 - Check all controls (throttle / kill cord / steering / engine) before leaving.







- No person to step aboard any Rib or craft **anywhere** without a life jacket / PFD (zero tolerance).
- Practice rescuing a boat on a lee shore with an anchor / warp (off pier wall).
- Report all incidences of personal injury to Boathouse via Injury/Accident Report Form
- Report all Rib problems, damage/breakage to Boathouse via Damage/Breakage Report Form
- Ensure the boathouse knows of your plan, departure and expected return times
- No children to be near the launch or recovery of any Rib.
- Authorise (certified) persons only may use the crane.

These are the principal aspects in relation to the safe operation of Rib safety / rescue craft but it does not represent a complete list.

Please use your discretion in preference for safety as the paramount motivation. You may be held accountable!

- 2 red hand flares
- 2 orange smoke hand flares
- knife and wire cutters
- horn top and gas
- Fire extinguisher
- hand bearing compass
- repair kit (boat and engine)
- waterproof torch
- spare kill cord

First Aid Kit

- foil blanket
- triangular bandages (calico)
- 2.5cm tape (lohmann silkafix)
- tweezers vent-aid, mask or suitable barrier
- plaster fabric tapes 2.5cm
- roll of plaster tape
- finger plasters (assorted sizes)
- antiseptic wipes
- melolin (non-adherent dressings)
- ambulances dressings (15, 13, 9, 8 and 7)
- eye pad
- conforming bandage 5cm
- eve wash / sterile water (25ml tubes)
- safety pins
- 2 pairs latex gloves.
