

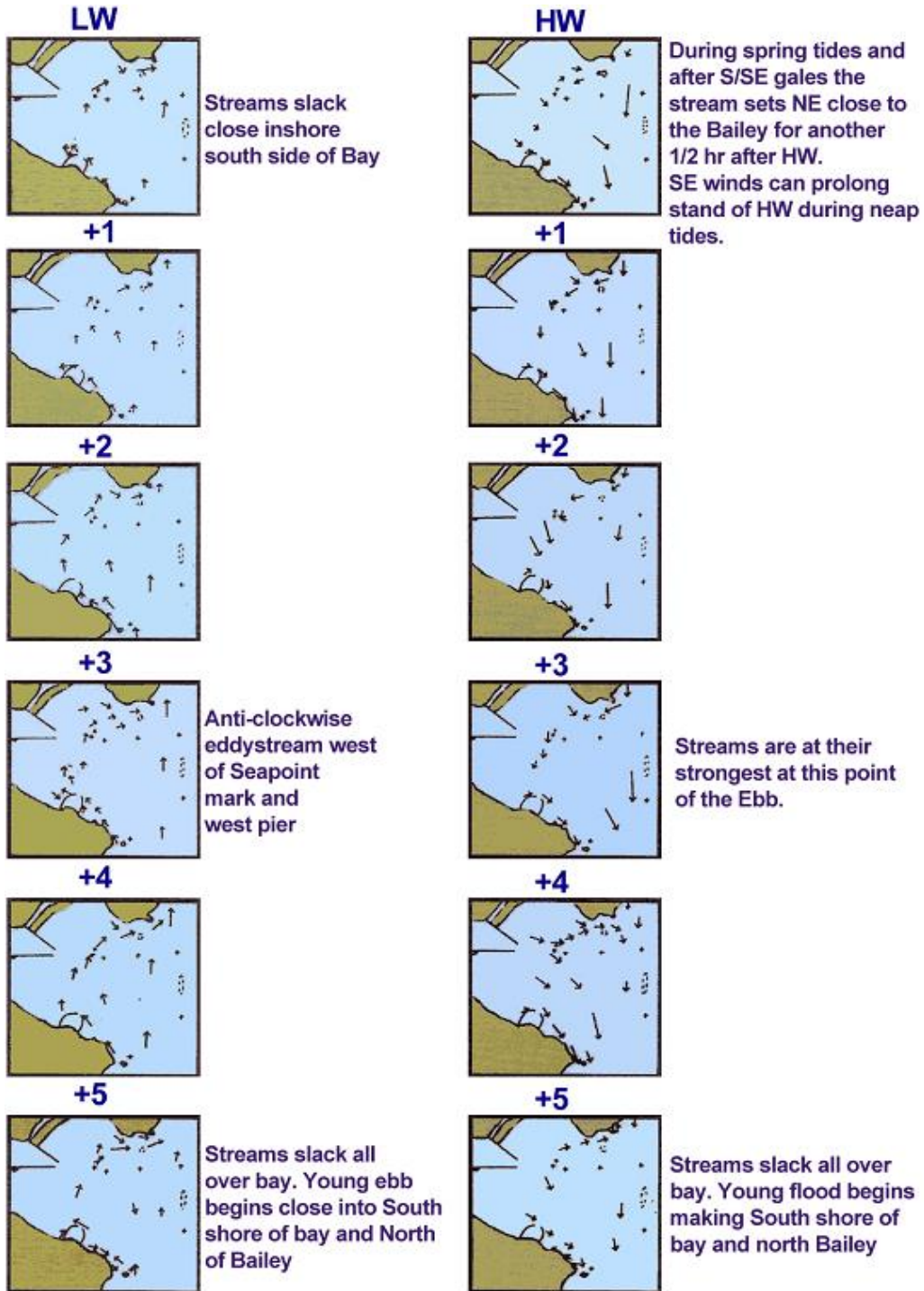

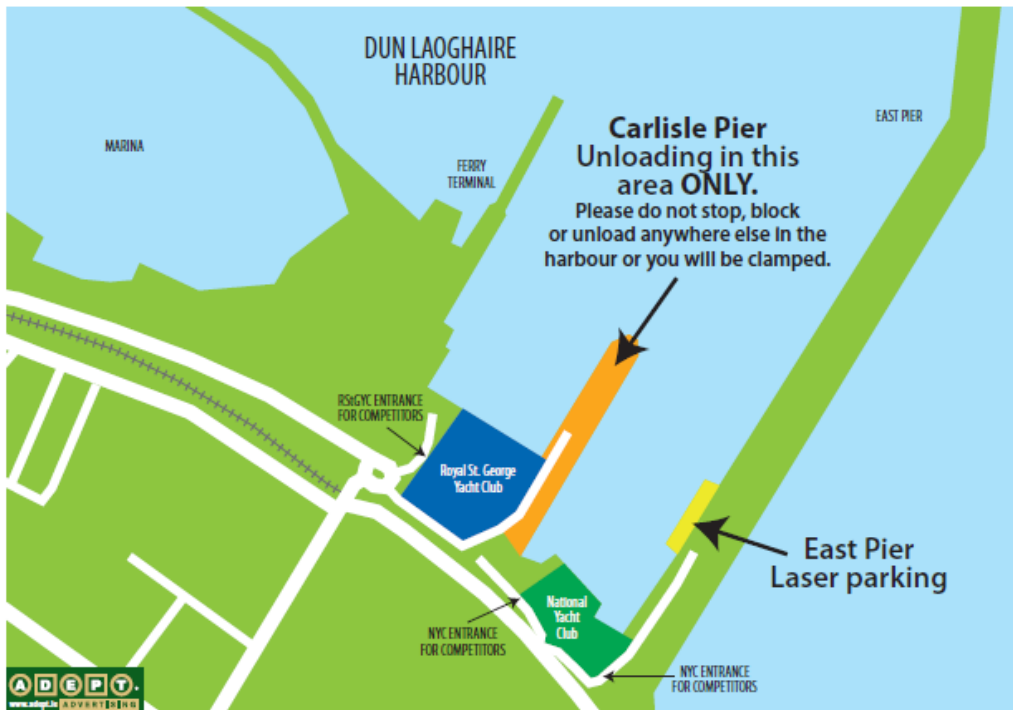
RSGYC	Royal St George Yacht Club, Dun Laoghaire. Co. Dublin (adjacent Carlisle Pier). Eircode A96 AY77

Security	A secure facility is offered to sailors for small items such as phones, wallets etc. while on the water. Items can be deposited outside the Men's changing room in the RSGYC in the small lockers. Alternatively, there are a limited number of lockers in both the men's and ladies changing rooms that can be rented for the duration of your stay. Please arrange this via the Race Office. No personal belongings should be left in the changing rooms or the Clubhouse overnight. Valuables should not be left in the changing rooms or unattended. The Club will accept no responsibility for any loss or damage.

Commercial Shipping – Strict warning is given by the Dun Laoghaire Rathdown County Council and the Dublin Port Authority that competitors must always keep well clear of ferries and other commercial shipping in the area. Competitors must comply with these warnings. Boats must keep to the sides of the harbour and not attempt to cross the bows of any commercial shipping. Any boats obstructing Commercial Shipping are liable to face large fines.

Dún Laoghaire Rathdown County Council (DLRCOCO) is the statutory commercial body charged with developing Dún Laoghaire Harbour as a marine tourism gateway to Ireland, maintaining and enhancing the recreational and amenity value of the Harbour and promoting investment and commercial development to support the historic Harbour’s long-term maintenance



It took 42 years to construct the harbour - from 1817 to 1859. During this time, 600 men were employed and the cost was estimated at one million pounds.

Water area:	Approximately 215 acres
Fairway:	Depth 5.5 to 8m with approx 600 moorings
Throughput:	Over 1,000,000 passengers per annum
Breakwater length:	East Pier 1,290m – West Pier 1,548m
Entrance Width:	232m (between the two piers)



The harbour is notable for its two granite piers, and is widely recognized as being one of the finest artificial harbours in the world

The East Pier is particularly popular with walkers, and approximately 3500 people/day walk the pier.

Ice cream and coffees are served in the Battery, the former munitions store, at the end of the Pier.
